1 THE COURT OFFICER: Calendar No. 34, Gershon
2 Aizikowich.

3 MR. Knabe: For the Office of the District
4 Attorney by Dietrich Knabe.

5 MR. VITEK: Nicholas Vitek for the Legal Aid
6 Society on behalf of Mr. Aizikowich. The Attorney of
7 Record is Brian Slater.

8 THE DEFENDANT: My attorney didn't come. I
9 don't know this man. I don't want him to appear on this
10 case.

11 THE COURT: Mr. Vitek works with Mr. Slater in
12 the Legal Aid Society. Sir, please. Sir, please do not
13 address the Court. You have the right to remain silent.
14 If you throw that away just to protest -- Mr. Vitek is
15 standing up to represent you. At this stage, you may be
16 giving up more than you realize by saying something that
17 the People could use to send you to jail.

18 THE DEFENDANT: Okay.

19 THE COURT: Sir?

20 THE DEFENDANT: I don't want him to represent
21 my case.

22 THE COURT: He is not -- Sir, first of all,
23 please control yourself in court, particularly when you
24 are on the record.

25 Second, Mr. Vitek is handling the case. He is

1 not here to try your case today.

2 What's the People's status?

3 MR. KNABE: The People are ready. The
4 arresting officer and complainant are at 350 Jay Street.

5 THE COURT: Where is Mr. Slater?

6 MR. VITEK: Your Honor, I believe he thought
7 discovery is -- I think he is ready for trial.

8 MR. Knabe: People are serving and filing
9 additional material and the 911 CD.

10 MR. VITEK: It will take some time to review.

11 THE COURT: Apparently, the People sent two
12 subpoenas to Coney Island Hospital for medical records.
13 I'm going to turn both subpoenas over to the People. I
14 don't know what is in there. I'm reminding the People of
15 their discovery obligations.

16 MR. KNABE: Yes, I'll leave a note for the
17 assigned assistant.

18 THE COURT: Did Mr. Slater leave good or bad
19 dates for trial?

20 MR. VITEK: He did not, Judge.

21 THE COURT: Thursday, December 13. Would you
22 please encourage Mr. Slater to speak with the defendant?

23 MR. VITEK: Yes, your Honor.

24 THE COURT: Thanks very much.


